Good morning, friends, on this, the fourth Sunday in Lent, which is Mothering Sunday.

Reading: Luke 15

<u>Reflection</u>: Notice why and how Jesus comes to tell these parables. The Pharisees and the scribes were grumbling about his acceptance - even positive welcome - for 'sinners'. But surely, we might think, that would be everyone? Clearly the Pharisees and scribes thought not! They were dividing people into the good and the bad - the religiously acceptable and the unacceptable sinners; but Jesus emphatically wasn't. These three parables go together. Like any good teacher, Jesus often emphasised his point by telling the same story in different ways: and here it was the story of the high value that God puts on the lost, and hence the vital importance of finding them.

In fact, the picture of God that emerges from today's reading is of a warm, welcoming figure. Not one that would condemn anyone out of hand; nor one that would impose behaviour by force or fear. The father in this last parable is remarkably open to letting his sons learn by experience, rather than trying to control their lives. He loves them; he waits for them in hope; and when he gets the chance he runs to welcome and to celebrate with joy. Is this the picture we have, in our hearts, of God; always waiting and wanting to embrace us with love?

These parables tell of God's love for the lost. Not for the perfect, or even the good, but for the lost. Basically for all of us. Thanks be to God! Amen

<u>Hymn</u>: O Love of God, how strong and true (R&S 100)
