Good morning friends, on the fifth Sunday of Easter and at the beginning of Christian Aid Week, which we remember in this service.

Let's pause as we prepare to worship... and then praise God as we sing:

Readings: Revelation 21: 1-6 and John 13: 31-35

<u>Reflection</u>: There is a reason the book of Revelation comes right at the end of the Bible: it makes us focus forwards, describing a vision of the future which was given to John; a vision which looks ahead, beyond the world that John lived in, and beyond the one that we live in two thousand years later, to 'a new heaven and a new earth'.

Our worlds, as we know them, are full of pain: we see the war in Ukraine in the news; we hear from Christian Aid of people living in desperate hunger in Zimbabwe after droughts repeatedly caused crops to fail; we know that there are people in our own communities struggling to care for family members or to cope with rapidly rising prices.

John's vision points us towards a future where God dwells with us - deliberately makes a home with us. In this future world there is no death or suffering, and God, who never intended them, wipes away all the tears of pain.

This picture of the Earth as God's home - this vision of a time when God and the world will be 'at home' with each other - is an inspiration. Being reminded of God's intentions,

of God's values and of God's compassion, can motivate us to work together with others, like Christian Aid, to care for those in need and to do what is in our power to wipe away their tears of pain right now. This Christian Aid Week we can work in the present towards the day in the future when injustice and suffering are ended. Amen.

Hymn: Hail to the Lord's anointed (R&S 127)

<u>Prayers:</u> God of time and eternity as we wonder about "what next" for the future we bring before you people and places in turmoil, for whom the future seems bleak or unimaginable. Where war has destroyed cities and societies we pray for your peace and your healing... Where crops have failed and left people hungry
