Bulletin for Christmas 2021

Happy Christmas, Friends! I hope you all have a warm, comfortable and thoroughly enjoyable Christmas weekend. followed by The Lord's Prayer

Reading: Luke chapter 2, verses 1 to 20

<u>Reflection</u>: Everybody must have been exhausted - Mary and Joseph from the journey, closely followed by Mary's labour and, eventually, the birth; the shepherds from looking after their sheep twenty-four hours a day, and living out on the hillside... Then, into the dark, starlit Bethlehem night appeared an angel. Not a small girl in an old sheet with tinsel in her hair, nor a musical creation from Robbie Williams. They both have their merits, but might not be what you want in the small hours when you're sleep-deprived.

This angel brought a message from God. A message which made the shepherds leave their sheep and run down into the town, filled with curiosity and wonder. A message which 'amazed... everyone who heard it'. A message which Mary treasured and 'pondered in her heart' for a long time. A message of 'good news of great joy for all the people'. And, wonderfully, 'all' includes us... so listen:

'To you is born this day in the city of David a Saviour, who is the Messiah, the Lord.' 'Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace...!" Amen!

Hymn: Who would think that what was needed (R&S 178)

Prayer:

Compassionate God, understanding of all our needs, you were born into our world among the poor, the sick and those anxious about the future...

We pray for all those who grieve this Christmas, and for those who live with violence or its threat.

We pray for the sick and those who care for them; and for those without a safe roof over their head or food on the table, at this, or any, time of year.

And we pray for those we love... and for ourselves...

Come into our sometimes dark and difficult world, bringing light and love, hope and joy!

In Jesus 'name we ask all our prayers including the unspoken prayers of our hearts.......

Hymn: O Come, all ye faithful (R&S 160)

Blessing: May we hear the angel today:

"Don't be afraid -

I'm bringing you good news of great joy!"

and may the blessing of God Father, Son and Holy Spirit,

be with us and with all those we love, this Christmas, and always. Amen
